MANHATTAN HOUSE AND BLAIR VOLTZ CLARKE HOST ARMORY SHOW COCKTAIL RECEPTION

Manhattan House, the iconic, landmarked, Modernist condominium on the Upper East Side, together with Blair Voltz Clarke, hosted an evening cocktail reception for artists and attendees of the Armory Show in James "Ford" Huniford's signature-designed residence at the building. 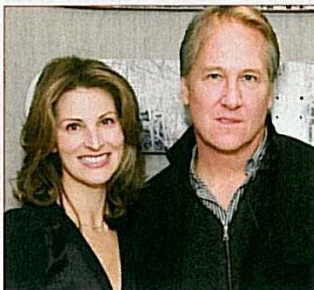
